The Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality & Water Supply Act of 2014 - \$10.5 billion

Ch. 5: Safe Drinking Water - \$3.02 billion

- \$100m for public health emergency actions
- \$400m to SWRCB for safe drinking water projects
- \$1.4b for Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) projects, allocated by hydrologic regions- including groundwater storage, recycled water storage, sediment removal and seismic retrofit of storage facilities
- \$100m for groundwater management plans
- \$20m to DPR for state parks drinking water and wastewater projects
- \$1b for groundwater treatment and remediation

Ch. 6: Water Quality - \$3.18 billion

- \$400m to SWRCB for small community wastewater treatment projects
- \$500m to SWRCB for stormwater capture and reuse
- \$500m to SWRCB for water recycling and advanced treatment technology projects
- \$600m for state obligations/settlements
- \$925m for statewide watershed improvements
- \$200m to Natural Resources Agency for multi-benefit watershed and urban rivers projects
- \$30m to SWRCB for resource conservation district watershed activities
- \$25m to SWRCB for projects to manage runoff from agricultural lands

Ch. 7: Sacramento San Joaquin Delta - \$1.3 billion

- \$900m to Delta Conservancy for Delta ecosystem restoration and sustainability projects
- \$400m for Delta levee and flood projects
- Not connected to the BDCP and supported by Delta communities

Ch. 8: Statewide Water System Operational Improvement for Drought Preparedness - \$3 billion

- \$3 billion in funding for surface and groundwater storage projects
- Continuously appropriated to the California Water Commission

Ch. 9: General Provisions

- Includes a savings clause for water rights, and for the 2009 Delta Reform Act
- Prohibits funding for construction, mitigation or operation of new conveyance
