

Delta Independent Science Board meeting

The Delta Independent Science Board (Delta ISB) will meet at 10:40 a.m. on September 17 regarding its current reviews and efforts. This includes a discussion on the Delta ISB's latest draft report, "The Science of Non-native Species in a Dynamic Delta," which was prepared as part of the Delta ISB's responsibility to provide scientific oversight of programs that support adaptive management of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The Delta ISB will discuss whether the latest draft report adequately addresses public comments. Based on the discussion, the Delta ISB may take action on next steps and consider approving the content of the report for submittal to the Delta Stewardship Council. As this will be the first meeting for six new members, the Delta ISB will discuss and prepare for future meetings and may take potential action on the frequency of future meetings.
